Dedication of the Lateran Basilica

REFLECTION ON THE READINGS

Today's celebration of the Dedication of the Cathedral Church of Rome (St John Lateran) is celebrated throughout the world, for this is the Mother Church of the whole Roman Rite. All three readings speak of the Temple of God, a House of Prayer for the People. St Paul links the physical building to the Christian: we are God's Temple! And together we are built up into the presence of God in the world. From this comes the theological statement - flowing from Vatican II - that We are the Church!

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Dear Friends,

It is appropriate that we celebrate the Church today, as Last Saturday evening's **Installation Mass with Bishop Vincent** was a **perfect example of the unity in diversity** that is our new Parish. Indeed, the supper gathering afterwards allowed so many parishioners to meet many new people from our 7 church communities. Again... **my thanks** to all who made this occasion such a success on so many levels.

On **Sunday 30th November** we will hold **our first Parish Assembly**. This will be an opportunity for all church communities to come together as we discern two things:

i) the membership of the proposed 5 Church Community Pastoral Teams, and ii) the Patron Saint of our new Parish of the Upper Blue Mountains.

Over the coming weeks I invite every parishioner to reflect on these two topics.

Firstly, pray and reflect about who you would like to be on your Pastoral Team...

Following a Synodal approach, those from the various churches [Sacred Heart, Blackheath (including St Paul's, Mt Victoria and St Joseph's, Megalong Valley); St Canice's, Katoomba; St Bonaventure's, Leura; St Francis Xavier's, Wentworth Falls; and Our Lady of Nativity, Lawson] will have a chance - under the guidance of myself and other members of the Ordained Ministers Team, together with Alison Ryan from the Mission Enhancement Team - to discern the 3-5 people you would like to lead and serve you and your church community.

Secondly, let's also reflect upon who would be an appropriate **Patron Saint for our new Parish**...

So far there have been a number of suggestions: **St Mary of the Cross Mackillop** (Australia's first canonical Saint and Patron our both our Country and our Diocese); **St Francis of Assisi** (because he was a man who envisioned the relationship between God and the natural environment, which is important to us in the beautiful Blue Mountains); **St Bernard of Montjoux** (a Swiss Saint who helped people crossing the Swiss Alps and is the Patron Saint of mountaineers; and after whom the St Bernard dog is named!); and All Saints (as this reflects the diversity of all our Patrons in our new Parish).

More on these topics over the weeks leading up to our **Parish Assembly on Sunday, 30th November, from 11:15am -12:45pm in St Canice's Hall, Katoomba.**





THE DEDICATION OF THE LATERAN BASILICA

Christians first met in homes to hear Jesus' teachings and to celebrate the Eucharist. When the Christians were no longer persecuted for their faith, they built beautiful churches. Sometime before the fourth century, a palace owned by a noble Roman family named Laterani had been built. It became the property of the Emperor Constantine. Constantine had recognised Christianity as the religion of the empire, and he donated to the Church the palace and other buildings on the site. This became Rome's oldest church. It was given the title Basilica of the Savior but later was dedicated to John the Baptist and called St. John Lateran.

St. John Lateran was the home of the popes—the centre of the Catholic world for many years. Twenty-eight popes are buried there. Although our pope now lives at the Vatican and presides at St. Peter's basilica, St. John Lateran is considered his cathedral as the bishop of Rome. The dedication of this basilica is a happy occasion for the Church because it reminds us of our beginnings, our unity. It stands as a monument to God and all that God does through the Church.

PARISH CHRISTMAS PARTY



ENTRANCE ANTIPHON

I saw the holy city, a new Jerusalem, coming down out of heaven from God, prepared like a bride adorned for her husband.

FIRST READING (Ezekiel 47:1-2,8-9,12)

The angel brought me to the entrance of the Temple, where a stream came out from under the Temple threshold and flowed eastwards, since the Temple faced east. The water flowed from under the right side of the Temple, south of the altar. He took me out by the north gate and led me right round outside as far as the outer east gate where the water flowed out on the right-hand side. He said, 'This water flows east down to the Arabah and to the sea; and flowing into the sea it makes its waters wholesome. Wherever the river flows, all living creatures teeming in it will live. Fish will be very plentiful, for wherever the water goes it brings health, and life teems wherever the river flows. Along the river, on either bank, will grow every kind of fruit tree with leaves that never wither and fruit that never fails; they will bear new fruit every month, because this water comes from the sanctuary. And their fruit will be good to eat and the leaves medicinal.'

RESPONSE TO THE PSALM

The waters of the river gladden the city of God.

SECOND READING (1 Corinthians 3:9-11,16-17)

You are God's building. By the grace God gave me, I succeeded as an architect and laid the foundations, on which someone else is doing the building. Everyone doing the building must work carefully. For the foundation, nobody can lay any other than the one which has already been laid, that is Jesus Christ.

Didn't you realise that you were God's temple and that the Spirit of God was living among you? If anybody should destroy the temple of God, God will destroy them, because the temple of God is sacred; and you are that temple.

GOSPEL ACCLAMATION

Alleluia, alleluia!

I have chosen and sanctified this house, says the Lord, that my name may remain in it for all time. Alleluia!

GOSPEL (John 2:13-22)

Just before the Jewish Passover Jesus went up to Jerusalem, and in the Temple he found people selling cattle and sheep and pigeons, and the money changers sitting at their counters there. Making a whip out of some cord, he drove them all out of the Temple, cattle and sheep as well, scattered the money changers' coins, knocked their tables over and said to the pigeon-sellers, 'Take all this out of here and stop turning my Father's house into a market.' Then his disciples remembered the words of scripture: Zeal for your house will devour me. The Jews intervened and said, 'What sign can you show us to justify what you have done?' Jesus answered, 'Destroy this sanctuary, and in three days I will raise it up.' The Jews replied, 'It has taken forty-six years to build this sanctuary: are you going to raise it up in three days?' But he was speaking of the sanctuary that was his body, and when Jesus rose from the dead, his disciples remembered that he had said this, and they believed the scripture and the words he had said.
