FROM THE SEVEN CHURCHES

3rd Sunday in Ordinary Time Year A 25 January 2026

Dear brothers and sisters,
This Sunday's readings are asking us about priorities.

Isaiah says: "God humbled the lands of Zebulun and the land of Naphtali," but His ultimate plan is to bestow glory on these lands. In the Gospel, we hear that it was in these very lands that Jesus started His mission publicly. Jesus is the great light that has come, and he breaks the rod of the oppressor. The light that



tells us who we are, what is our purpose in life and what is our ultimate destiny. With this knowledge, the things that oppress us are rendered powerless. What oppresses us is our inward focus. Notice the comments of St Paul's letter to the Corinthians: "I am for Paul", "I am for Cephus" ... It's the "I." As St Paul points out, we need to look towards Christ, His death and resurrection. He

emptied Himself for us so we could rise to new life with Him. Be resurrected through Him, but we must put Him first as He put us first. We must humble ourselves. That's what we see in the Gospel with the calling of the Apostles. They left their lives behind- family, friends and businesses to follow Christ. For us, this does not mean we have to physically walk away from our work or families, but we need to get our priorities straight. Christ first and all else after that. Then, all will function as it should. But, we must be careful to follow the real Christ and not the one we invent for ourselves. The only way to do this is through prayer, contemplation, education in faith and the sacraments.

The blessing of Catholic church bells, often called a "baptism," consecrates them with holy water and oil, naming them after saints to signify their sacred role in calling people to prayer, announcing Mass, marking life's major events, and symbolically driving away evil spirits, a tradition rooted in ancient practices of using sound for divine communication and protection, evolving from monastic use to parish life, and mirroring Christian initiation rites.

The consecration of a bell is a very solemn function, and its origin must be sought far back in the eighth century, if not earlier. It has always been the practice of the Church to bless any objects that were used in the service of God. In virtue of the exorcisms and

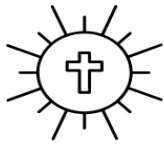

blessings bestowed on them, these material objects acquire a spiritual efficaciousness — that is, they become sacramentals. As such their virtue is both *ex opere operato* and *ex opere operantis*, by which we do not imply that there resides in consecrated bells a kind of magical power, which is always and infallibly operative, irrespective of the dispositions

of those who seek its help. But the sound of the bells is meant to awaken in our hearts sentiments of faith and trust in God, and thus we may feel assured of special protection, because our Lord has empowered His Church to make of material objects the means and vehicles of heavenly favours. The blessing of a bell, especially that of many bells, is a festive occasion, one that would surely bring together many people, both clergy and laity. The sacred function would very naturally be followed by the exercise of Christian hospitality. Be this as it may, let us listen to the voice of the bell as to the voice of Christ, for it reminds us of our heavenly vocation and supernatural destiny. An old Latin inscription often found on bells sums up most admirably the office of the bell and the burden of its song: *Vivos voco, Mortuos plango, Festa decora, Fulgura frango*. The following inscription on a bell, which hangs in the steeple of an old Devonshire village, expresses the same meaning: "That folk may come to church in time, I chime; When pleasure's on the wing, I ring; To speed the parting soul, I toll."

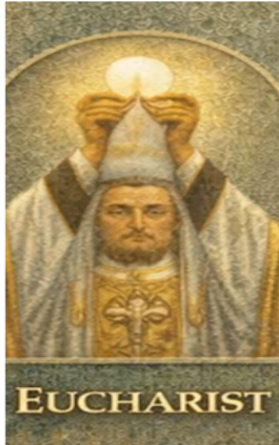

We are inviting all parishioners to come and share in this beautiful gift that we are blessed and grateful to have in our parish. In anticipation of the sign-up weekend we will be including reflections on Adoration in the bulletin over the next few weeks.

What is Adoration?

"Adoration is the acknowledgement of God as God, creator and saviour, the Lord and Master of everything that exists as infinite and merciful love" (Catechism of the Catholic Church 2096). "Adoration is homage of the spirit to the King of glory, respectful silence in the presence of the ever greater God" (CCC 2628).

The Concise Dictionary of Theology defines Adoration as "the highest reverence to be offered only to God, our creator, redeemer, and sanctifier who alone should be worshiped and glorified." "Adoration is the word used to express those acts of divine worship which are directed to God only, and of which the characteristics are recognition of His perfection and omnipotence and our own complete dependence upon Him" (A Catholic Dictionary, Tan, 1997).

St. Elizabeth of Hungary remarked: "Adoration. This is a word from heaven. It seems to me that it could be defined as an ecstasy of love. It is love overwhelmed by the beauty, the strength, the immense grandeur of the Beloved. It falls into sort of a swoon, into a full deep silence, the silence that David spoke of when he cried out 'silence is Thy praise'. And it is the most beautiful of all praise that is sung eternally in the bosom of the unchanging Trinity, and it is also the last effort of the soul as it overflows and can say no more."

What is Eucharistic Adoration and why is it so tremendously important?

Eucharistic adoration is an expression of our love for Jesus, who loves us so much that He never wants to leave us and stays with us day and night in the Blessed Sacrament. He says: "Behold I am with you always," because "I have loved you with an everlasting love, so I am constant in My affection for you" (Mt. 28:20; Jer 31:3). Eucharistic adoration is the respect and worship we give to Jesus, who is truly present to us under the appearance of bread and wine. The Eucharist is a priceless treasure; by not only celebrating it but also by praying before it outside of Mass we are enabled to make contact with the very wellspring of grace. As St. Alphonsus Liguori noted, "of all devotions, that of adoring Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament is the greatest after the sacraments, the one dearest to God and the one most helpful to us" (CCC 1418).

Third Sunday in Ordinary Time

ENTRANCE ANTIPHON

O sing a new song to the Lord; sing to the Lord, all the earth. In his presence are majesty and splendour, strength and honour in his holy place.

FIRST READING (Isaiah 8:23 – 9:3)

In days past the Lord humbled the land of Zebulun and the land of Naphtali, but in days to come he will confer glory on the Way of the Sea on the far side of Jordan, province of the nations. The people that walked in darkness has seen a great light; on those who live in a land of deep shadow a light has shone. You have made their gladness greater, you have made their joy increase, they rejoice in your presence as people rejoice at harvest time, as people are happy when they are dividing the spoils. For the yoke that was weighing on him, the bar across his shoulders, the rod of his oppressor, these you break as on the day of Midian.

RESPONSORIAL PSALM

The Lord is my light and my salvation.

SECOND READING (1 Corinthians 1:10-13, 17)

I appeal to you, brothers and sisters, for the sake of our Lord Jesus Christ, to make up the differences between you, and instead of disagreeing among yourselves, to be united again in your belief and practice. From what Chloe's people have been telling me, my dear brothers and sisters, it is clear that there are serious differences among you. What I mean are all these slogans that you have, like: 'I am for Paul', 'I am for Apollos', 'I am for Cephas', 'I am for Christ'. Has Christ been parcelled out? Was it Paul that was crucified for you? Were you baptised in the name of Paul? For Christ did not send me to baptise, but to preach the Good News, and not to preach that in the terms of philosophy in which the crucifixion of Christ cannot be expressed.

GOSPEL Acclamation

Alleluia, alleluia!

Jesus preached the Good News of the kingdom and healed all who were sick.

GOSPEL (Matthew 4:12-23)

Hearing that John had been arrested Jesus went back to Galilee, and leaving Nazareth he went and settled in Capernaum, a lakeside town on the borders of Zebulun and Naphtali. In this way the prophecy of Isaiah was to be fulfilled: Land of Zebulun! Land of Naphtali! Way of the sea on the far side of Jordan, Galilee of the nations! The people that lived in darkness has seen a great light; on those who dwell in the land and shadow of death a light has dawned. From that moment Jesus began his preaching with the message, 'Repent, for the kingdom of heaven is close at hand.' As he was walking by the Sea of Galilee he saw two brothers, Simon, who was called Peter, and his brother Andrew; they were making a cast in the lake with their net, for they were fishermen. And he said to them, 'Follow me and I will make you fishers of people.' And they left their nets at once and followed him.

Going on from there he saw another pair of brothers, James son of Zebedee and his brother John; they were in their boat with their father Zebedee, mending their nets, and he called them. At once, leaving the boat and their father, they followed him. He went round the whole of Galilee teaching in their synagogues, proclaiming the Good News of the kingdom and curing all kinds of diseases and sickness among the people.
